Fees

Badge Programs

\$70.00 for up to 15 scouts. Additional scouts are \$5.50 each. No charge for parents, siblings, or leaders that attend the program. Programs are $1-\frac{1}{2}$ hours in length.

Night Hike & Campfire Programs

\$100.00 for up to 18 participants. This number includes scouts, siblings, parents, and troop leaders. Additional persons are \$5.50 each. Programs are 2 hours in length.

Fees are effective through August 31, 2023.

Troops must have 1 adult chaperone for every 4 boy scouts.

Churchville Nature Center offers yearround opportunities for volunteers to help with a variety of events or projects.


