Perennials

Achillea millefolium 'Dertel's Rose' (Yarrow) ☀ β χ ☺ ☹

COLOR: Pink

HEIGHT: 12-15"

BLOOM: Late Summer

SOIL: Dry, Average

COMMENTS: Carefree garden plant that spreads easily to fill available space. 'Dertel's Rose' is rosy pink with good strong color that is slow to fade.

Anemone Canadensis (Meadow Anemone/Canadian Anemone) ☀ ◯ ❖ ☹

COLOR: White

HEIGHT: 12-18"

BLOOM: late spring-early summer

SOIL: moist (wetlands), average soil

COMMENTS: Prefers moist soil rich in organic matter. More moisture is required for growing in full sun conditions. Slightly drier soil is tolerated with more shade.

***Asarum canadense (Wild Ginger)** ☼ ◯ ☺ ☹

COLOR: Maroon-brown (beneath foliage)

HEIGHT: 6-12"

BLOOM: Late Spring/Early Summer

SOIL: Well drained, acidic

COMMENTS: This deciduous perennial groundcover has velvety green, heart-shaped leaves. A great addition to the spring woodland garden. Roots have similar scent to culinary ginger, but not related.

Aquilegia canadensis (Wild Columbine) ☼ ◯ ☺ ☹ ☹

COLOR: Red spurs, yellow sepals

HEIGHT: 1-3'

BLOOM: April - June

SOIL: Moist, well-drained soil

COMMENTS: Great and consistent performance.

Aruncus dioicus (Goat's Beard, or Bride's Feathers) ☀ ☼ ◯ ☿ β

COLOR: White

HEIGHT: 3-5'

BLOOM: May, June

SOIL: Moist, wet

COMMENTS: Showy, finger-like flower clusters form feathery masses of all male or all female flowers.

Asclepias incarnata (Rose Swamp Milkweed) ☀ ◯ ☺ ☹ ☹

COLOR: Bright purple

HEIGHT: 3-4'

BLOOM: June - July

SOIL: Moist

COMMENTS: Willow-like leaves. A great insect plant - a butterfly magnet, as with all milkweeds.

***Asclepias syriaca (Common Milkweed)** ☀ ☺ β ☹

COLOR: Deep pink

HEIGHT: 2-5'

BLOOM: June - July

SOIL: Well-drained

COMMENTS: Best known as food for monarch caterpillars. Robust and fragrant.

Aster laevis "Bluebird' (Smooth Aster) ☀ ◯ ☿ ☺ ☹ ☹

COLOR: violet-blue w/yellow centers

HEIGHT: 3-4'

BLOOM: September

SOIL: moist to average

COMMENTS: Single 1.5" daisy flowers with gold centers

Aster novae-angliae—“Purple Dome” (New England Aster) ☼○☺βχ

COLOR: Deep purple HEIGHT: 18"
BLOOM: August—September SOIL: Moist to average
COMMENTS: Compact variety that provides a burst of vivid deep purple color

Aster oblongifolius “October Skies” (Aromatic Aster) ☼○βχϝ

COLOR: Violet HEIGHT: 18"
BLOOM: September - October SOIL: Average to dry
COMMENTS: Showy, strikingly beautiful mounded appearance with masses of blue-lavender daisy-like flowers with yellow centers and is a preferred nectar source for many butterfly species.

Baptisia australis (Blue Wild Indigo/Blue False Indigo) ☼○βϞχ

COLOR: Indigo blue HEIGHT: 3-4'
BLOOM: Late spring-early summer SOIL: Dry to average, well-drained soil
COMMENTS: Upright perennial which features purple, lupine-like flowers. Stems with seed pods are valued additions to dried flower arrangements.

Callirhoe involucrata (Wine Cups/Purple Poppymallow) ☼☺ϝχ

COLOR: Pink HEIGHT: 6-8"
BLOOM: Summer SOIL: Dry to moist, well-drained soil
COMMENTS: Attractive plant with low growing, dark green foliage with an explosion of electric purple, single flowers. This plant behaves like an ivy. Let it drape over stone walls or creep between stones.

***Caltha palustris (Marsh Marigold)** ☼○☺ϝ

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 8-12"
BLOOM: Early SOIL: Moist to wet
COMMENTS: Shiny green, round foliage, one of the first wildflowers to bloom in early spring.

Carex amphibola (Creek Sedge) ☼*○Ϟ☺

COLOR: Green HEIGHT: 8-10"
BLOOM: Early Spring/Semi Evergreen SOIL: Moist, average
COMMENTS: Adaptable native sedge naturally occurring. It forms a compact and semi-erect mound. It lends itself well to native shade gardens, along wood paths or as a slope stabilizer. It is a vigorous clump former with shiny, narrow green foliage

***Carex plantaginea (Plantain Lea Sedge/Seersucker Sedge)** ☼*○ϝϞ☺

COLOR: Green HEIGHT: 8-10"
BLOOM: Early Spring/Semi Evergreen SOIL: Moist, average
COMMENTS: Bold textural contrast with broad shiny deep green leaves that are puckered like holiday ribbon. Should be cut back in late winter to maintain its bright appearance.

Chelone glabra (Turtlehead) ☼○☺☿

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 2-4'
 BLOOM: August – September SOIL: Slightly acid moist soil
 COMMENTS: Native; lustrous, deep green foliage; upright perennial; flowers in small clusters on stems; pinch shoot tips in Spring for bushier growth.

Chelone lyonii 'Hot Lips' (Pink Turtlehead) ☼○☼☿

COLOR: Brilliant rose-pink HEIGHT: 2-4'
 BLOOM: August – September SOIL: average to moist
 COMMENTS: Interesting bronze-green early season growth. Good cut flower.

Clematis virginiana (Old Man's Beard or Virgin's Bower) ☼☼○☼☺☿ρ

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 12-20'
 BLOOM: Late summer, fall SOIL: Average, moist
 COMMENTS: This vigorous native *Clematis virginiana* is covered in showy, sweetly-scented white flowers. Hummingbirds and bees enjoy the nectar while songbirds roost in the foliage

Echinacea - 'Cheyenne Spirit' (Coneflower) ☼○β×☿

COLOR: Mixed colors (see comments) HEIGHT: 24-30"
 BLOOM: July – August SOIL: Average to dry soil
 COMMENTS: This plant flowers in a variety of colors from purple, pink, red and orange tones to lighter yellows, creams and whites.

Echinacea purpurea "Ruby Star"- (Purple coneflower) ☼○☼β×

COLOR: Violet HEIGHT: 2-3'
 BLOOM: Summer SOIL: average to dry, well-drained soil
 COMMENTS: Large flat topped flowers that are a deeper purple pink, almost ruby red, than most others. Easy to grow, tough, and heat and drought tolerant once established.

***Eryngium yuccifolium - (Rattlesnake Master)** ☼β☿×

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 4-5'
 BLOOM: Late summer SOIL: Dry, well-drained soil
 COMMENTS: Striking, white flower heads that resemble thistles and sword-like foliage make button snake-root an excellent accent plant in the garden. Looks very similar to yucca. Easily grown full sun.

***Eupatorium dubium 'Little Joe' (3-nerved Joe Pye Weed)** ☼○☺β

COLOR: Pink-lavender HEIGHT: 4-5'
 BLOOM: July – September SOIL: Moist, acidic
 COMMENTS: Shorter than most other Joe Pye Weeds.

***Eupatorium perfoliatum (Common Boneset)** ☼○β☺☿

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 3-4'
 BLOOM: Late summer-fall SOIL: Wet, sandy or clay soil
 COMMENTS: Needs constant moisture, great for pond banks, moist beds and wet meadows.

Heliopsis helianthoides (False Sunflower) ☼○β☿

COLOR: Red, yellow HEIGHT: 3 - 4'
 BLOOM: Late summer SOIL: Moist or dry
 COMMENTS: "Burning Hearts" is a show-stopping color that is also attractive to bees and butterflies.

Hibiscus moscheutos (Swamp Rosemallow) ☼○β

COLOR: Pink to white HEIGHT: 3 - 7'
 BLOOM: Late summer SOIL: Wet
 COMMENTS: Shrublike herbaceous perennial with large, glabrous leaves and 4-5" wide flowers that last only for one day, but appear consistently until the end of the season.

***Iris cristata (Dwarf Crested Iris)** ☼○☿

COLOR: Blue HEIGHT: 6-8"
 BLOOM: Late spring/early summer SOIL: Rich, moist, well-drained
 COMMENTS: Considerably huskier and more vigorous than others of the species, this sweet giant boasts 3" flowers of delicate light blue with golden crests and deep blue accents.

Iris versicolor (Blue Flag) ☼○☺

COLOR: Blue HEIGHT: 3'
 BLOOM: May & June SOIL: Moist.
 COMMENTS: Native wetland plant. Moist location essential.

Lobelia cardinalis (Cardinal Flower) ☼○☺×

COLOR: Scarlet red HEIGHT: 32"
 BLOOM: July – September SOIL: Very moist
 COMMENTS: A spike of flowers. Will self-seed. This plant is pollinated exclusively by hummingbirds.

Lobelia siphilitica (Great Blue Lobelia) ☼○☺β×

COLOR: Blue HEIGHT: 30"
 BLOOM: July – September SOIL: Moist
 COMMENTS: Vigorous; will self-seed.

Lonicera sempervirens (Trumpet Honeysuckle Vine) ☼○☺☹☹☹

COLOR: Red HEIGHT: 3-6'
BLOOD: May – frost SOIL: Average
COMMENTS: A vine that is perfect for arbors and trellises. Hummingbird magnet.

Meehanian cordata (Meehan’s Mint, or Creeping Mint) ☼○☹☹☺

COLOR: Blue Violet HEIGHT: 12"
BLOOD: Late Spring-Early Summer SOIL: Moist to average
COMMENTS: Long, trailing stems run across the ground and root along the way. In late spring the green carpet gives way to hundreds of blue flowers opening to reveal spotted throats.

Monarda ‘Purple Rooster’ (Bee Balm) ☼○☹☹☹

COLOR: Violet HEIGHT: 30-36"
BLOOD: Summer SOIL: Average, well-drained
COMMENTS: Upright, rigid stems create a strongly vertical aesthetic while the dull green leaves have a rough, sand-papery texture that creates a different look compared most of the other bee balms.

Monarda didyma - ‘Jacob Cline’ (Bee Balm) ☼○☺☹☹☹

COLOR: Rich red HEIGHT: 30"
BLOOD: June – July SOIL: Moist, rich soil
COMMENTS: Fragrant aromatic foliage; numerous tubular flowers extend out of a ball-shaped whorl; vigorous growth habits; much more mildew resistant and larger flowered; good cut flower.

Monarda fistulosa ‘Clair Grace’ (Wild Bergamont) ☼○☺☹☹☹

COLOR: Pale lavender HEIGHT: 2-4'
BLOOD: June – July SOIL: average
COMMENTS: Aromatic leaves are used in Earl Grey tea.

***Oenothera fruticosa ‘Fireworks’ (Sundrops/Narrowleaf Evening Primrose)** ☼☹☹☹☺

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 15-28"
BLOOD: Late spring-early summer SOIL: Well drained, dry , average
COMMENTS: Deep bronze foliage and red stems are contrasted by red buds opening to canary yellow blooms. The individual flowers may not last for more than a day or two, but they open in succession leaving the plant in continuous bloom.

***Pachysandra procubens (Allegheny Spurge)** ☼○☺☹☹

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 6-10"
BLOOD: Late spring, early summer SOIL: Dry, Average
COMMENTS: Native evergreen gem. Fragrant, white flower spikes appear in spring, later becoming camouflaged by a new flush of gorgeous, crisp green foliage..

Packera aurea, formerly Senecio aureus (Golden Ragwort) ☼☼○☺☹☹

COLOR: Bright golden HEIGHT: 12"
BLOOD: May SOIL: Average to moist
COMMENTS: Prefers partial shade. A strong ground cover where happy.

Panicum virgatum (Switchgrass) ☼○☹☹☹

COLOR: Red HEIGHT: 3-5'
BLOOD: Summer SOIL: Average to dry
COMMENTS: An upright landscape grass with lovely blue green foliage that turns yellow in fall. In late summer airy wheat-colored flowers appear and remain attractive well into fall. Easy to Grow.

Penstemon digitalis (Beardtongue) ☼○☹☹☹☹☺

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 3-4"
BLOOD: Late Spring - Early Summer SOIL: Average, Well drained
COMMENTS: Drought tolerant, tough as nails, and deer resistant. The tubular flowers make an excellent landing pad for bees, butterflies and hummingbirds alike!

Phlox divaricata - ‘May Breeze’ (Wild Blue Phlox) ☼○☹☹☹

COLOR: Pale blue HEIGHT: 12-15"
BLOOD: Late Spring - Early Summer SOIL: Average to moist
COMMENTS: A small-statured wild sweet william with loose clusters of fragrant, pale blue, almost white flowers that drive the butterflies wild! .

Phlox paniculata - ‘Jeana’ (Garden Phlox) ☼○☹☹☹

COLOR: Pink HEIGHT: 4-5'
BLOOD: Late Summer to Fall SOIL: Average, well-drained
COMMENTS: Varying shades of sweetly scented, lavender-pink flowers, vibrant midsummer through early autumn. Expect butterflies and other pollinators.

***Physostegia virginiana ‘Pink Manners’ (Obedience Plant)** ☼☺☹☹☹

COLOR: Pink HEIGHT: 36"
BLOOD: Late Summer SOIL: Average
COMMENTS: Tubular flowers in shades of lavender-pink adorn this taller, snapdragon-like spikes. An adaptable and easy-to-grow native, the strong stems do not require staking.

***Podophyllum peltatum (May Apple)** ☼○☺☹☹

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 12-18"
BLOOD: March-May SOIL: Moist, well-drained
COMMENTS: Nice addition to a shade or woodland garden.

Polemonium reptans (Spreading Jacobs Ladder) ☼○☺☹☹

COLOR: light blue HEIGHT: 10-12"
BLOOD: Late Spring SOIL: Average to moist
COMMENTS: A free-flowering woodland native with delicate light blue flowers topping ladder-like foliage in late spring. A good light-textured groundcover in areas with average to moist soils.

Pycnanthemum muticum (Short-Toothed Mountain Mint) ☼○⋈βχ⌘❖☺

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 2-3'
BLOOM: Late Summer SOIL: Well-drained
COMMENTS: Very attractive to beneficial garden insects such as bees & butterflies. Mountain Mint is loaded with pulegone, the same insect repellent found in pennyroyal. It can be rubbed on the skin to repel mosquitoes!

Pycnanthemum verticillatum variety pilosum (Hairy Mountain Mint) ☼⋈ρ

COLOR: white HEIGHT: 3-1-3'
BLOOM: Summer SOIL: dry, average
COMMENTS: An attractive clump-forming native perennial with silver foliage. When the white flowers bloom in summer, they are covered in bees and butterflies! The seeds are loved by birds.

Ratibida pinnata (Prairie Coneflower) ☼○⋈βχ

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 3-5"
BLOOM: Late Summer SOIL: Average, well-drained
COMMENTS: Brown cones with yellow ray petals adorn this midwestern prairie native in midsummer. Emits a soft fragrance of anise when seeds are crushed. Long-lived and very easy to grow in most situations. Great for attracting birds and butterflies.

Rudbeckia fulgida 'Goldstrum' (Black-eyed Susan 'Goldstrum') ☼○☺βχ

COLOR: Bright gold HEIGHT: 24-30"
BLOOM: July-Oct. SOIL: Average to dry
COMMENTS: Bright gold petals with a deep brown cone highlight the garden in late summer.

Rudbeckia laciniata (Cutleaf Coneflower) ☼○βχρ⌘☺

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 5-8'
BLOOM: Late Summer SOIL: Average
COMMENTS: Tall, erect and stately native with yellow ray petals accented by a green center held by coarse, hairy stems. Excellent cut flower and butterfly magnet.

***Sanguinaria canadensis (Bloodroot)** ⌘○☺

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 6-10'
BLOOM: March-April S SOIL: Moist, well drained.
COMMENTS: Each flower stalk has one solitary flower. The sap of the plant is red, thus the name.

***Sedum ternatum 'Larinem Park (Stonecrop)** ☼○χ⋈

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 6"
BLOOM: Late Spring to Early Summer SOIL: Average, well-drained
COMMENTS: A low-growing, succulent native groundcover for shade. In spring it is covered in white star-shaped flowers. Slow spreading. More tolerant of shade and moisture than other Sedum species.

Silene caroliniana 'Short & Sweet' (Wild Pink) ☼○⌘β☺

COLOR: Deep Pink HEIGHT: 6-8"
BLOOM: Late spring /early summer SOIL: Average to rich, moist to dry
COMMENTS: Compact and easy to grow, it is an excellent choice for bright shade or full sun. Covered in deep pink flowers

Sisyrinchium angustifolium 'Lucern' (Blue-eyed Grass) ☼○⋈χ

COLOR: Purple HEIGHT: 10-12"
BLOOM: Late spring-early summer SOIL: Moist, well drained
COMMENTS: Great little plant for borders, pathways, rock gardens and woodlands edge with a thin, grassy-looking foliage.

Solidago odora (Anise Scented Goldenrod/Sweet Goldenrod) ☼○βχ⋈☺

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 2-4'
BLOOM: Late summer/fall SOIL: Well drained, moist to dry
COMMENTS: Wonderfully fragrant leaves give off an anise scent when crushed, reminiscent of licorice candy. Attracts butterflies, bees, ladybugs, lacewings and other beneficial insects.

Solidago sphacelate 'Golden Fleece' (Goldenrod, or Autumn Goldenrod) ☼○βχ⋈β

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 18-24"
BLOOM: Late summer SOIL: Average, Dry
COMMENTS: Stunning show of sprays of golden yellow flowers. Semievergreen heart-shaped leaves. Truly an excellent groundcover and bee and butterfly charmer!

***Stylophorum diphyllosum (Celandine Poppy/Wood Poppy) ***☼☺

COLOR: Golden yellow

HEIGHT: 12-24"

BLOOM: Spring

SOIL: Moist to moderately damp

COMMENTS: Easy to grow native that will self-sow and form a ground cover.

Thermopsis villosa (Carolina Lupine)☼☺

COLOR: Yellow

HEIGHT: 3-4'

BLOOM: Summer

SOIL: Average

COMMENTS: Clump-forming perennial with dense spikes of sulphur yellow. Compound foliage is attractive late into the season. Very durable and long lived once established. Beautiful cut flower.

***Tiarella cordifolia (Foamflower)**☼☺☺

COLOR: White

HEIGHT: 5" (Spring stalks 8-12")

BLOOM: Early Spring

SOIL: Moist, rich soil.

COMMENTS: Excellent ground cover or shady edge. Spreads quickly.

***Tradescantia ohiensis (Spiderwort)**☼☺☺

COLOR: lavender

HEIGHT: 2-3'

BLOOM: June – September

SOIL: moist to dry

COMMENTS: This Pennsylvania Native is a great landscape plant for hot sunny locations, unlike others in the genus. Attractive bluish-grey foliage with flowers in blue, pink or purple from early June to September.

Vernonia noveboracensis (New York Ironweed)☼☺β

COLOR: Bright purple

HEIGHT: 4-7'

BLOOM: August – September

SOIL: Average to moist

COMMENTS: Lovely native that adapts well to any moist location.

Veronicastrum virginicum (Lavender Towers)☼☺βχ⌘

COLOR: Violet

HEIGHT: 4-5'

BLOOM: Late summer

Soil: Well-drained

COMMENTS: Attractive to pollinators. Drought tolerant, good for meadows or backdrop of naturalized gardens.

***Matteuccia struthiopteris (Ostrich Fern)**☼☺☺⌘⌘

HEIGHT: 3-5'

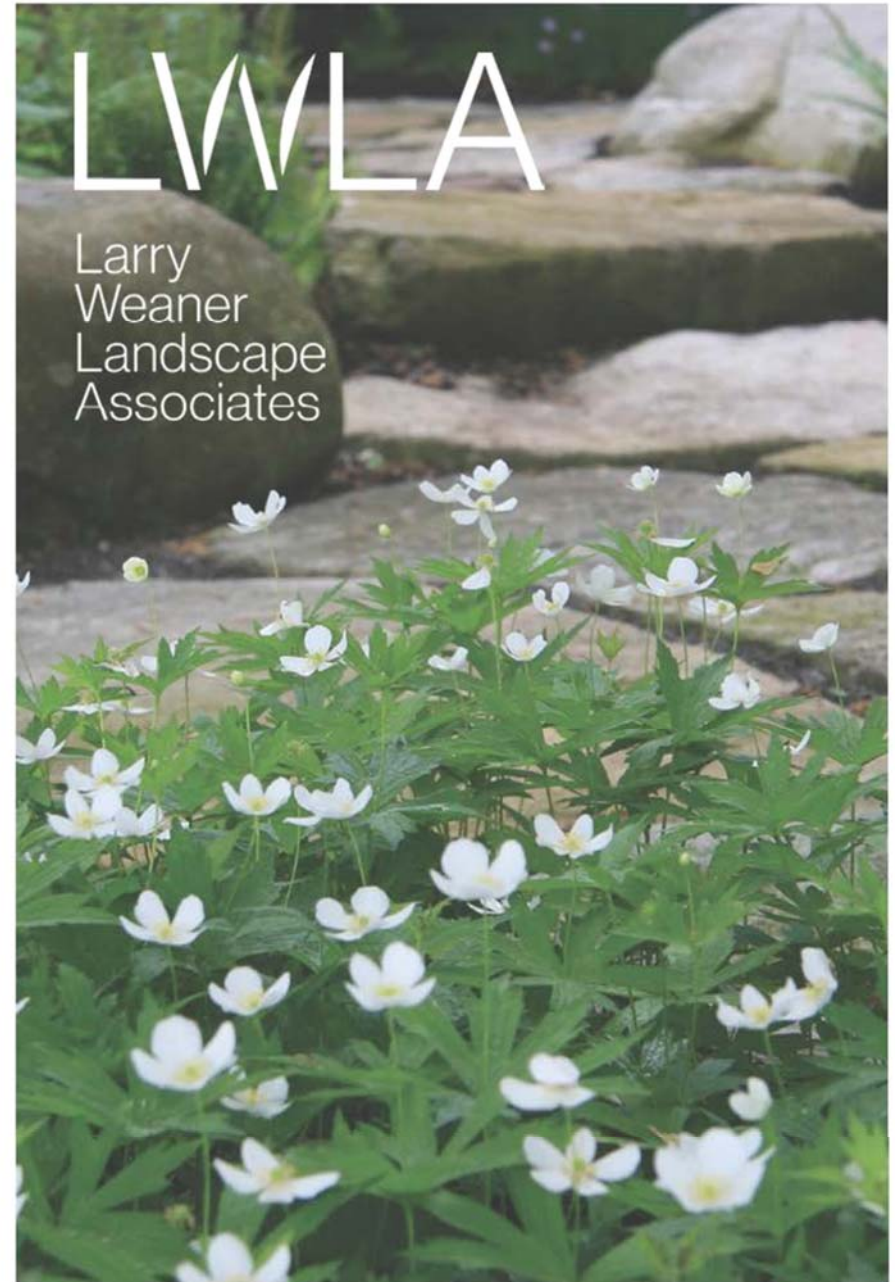
