Perennials

Achillea millefolium 'Ortels Rose' (Yarrow) ☼βχϝ☺

COLOR: Pink HEIGHT: 12-15"
BLOOM: Late Summer SOIL: Dry, Average
COMMENTS: Carefree garden plant that spreads easily to fill available space. 'Ortel's Rose' is rosy pink with good strong color that is slow to fade.

Agastache foeniculum (Anise Hyssop or Blue Giant Hyssop) ☼○β⋈χϝ

COLOR: Violet HEIGHT: 2-4'
BLOOM: Late Summer SOIL: Average to dry soil
COMMENTS: Upright, clump-forming perennial native to parts of the upper Midwest and Great Plains region. Violet flowers are densely packed along showy, cylindrical, terminal spikes. Foliage carries a refreshing anise scent, attracting hummingbirds and butterflies.

Allium cernuum (Nodding Onion) ☼○ϝχρ

COLOR: Pink HEIGHT: 12-18"
BLOOM: Summer SOIL: dry, average or moist soil
COMMENTS: Found on ledges, in dry meadows, gravel, rocky or wooded slopes, this delicate onion has gently nodding pink flowers in late spring. Easy, dependable and very drought tolerant once established.

Aquilegia canadensis (Wild Columbine) *○☺⋈ϝ

COLOR: Red spurs, yellow sepals HEIGHT: 1-3'
BLOOM: April - June SOIL: Moist, well-drained soil
COMMENTS: Great and consistent performance.

***Asarum canadense (Wild Ginger)** *○☺ϝ

COLOR: Maroon-brown (beneath foliage) HEIGHT: 6-12"
BLOOM: Late Spring/Early Summer SOIL: Well drained, acidic
COMMENTS: This deciduous perennial groundcover has velvety green, heart-shaped leaves. A great addition to the spring woodland garden. Roots have similar scent to culinary ginger, but not related.

Asclepias incarnata (Rose Swamp Milkweed) ☼○☺βϝ* may be late & not for sale yet

COLOR: Bright purple HEIGHT: 3-4'
BLOOM: June - July SOIL: Moist
COMMENTS: Willow-like leaves. A great insect plant - a butterfly magnet, as with all milkweeds.

Asclepias syriaca (Common Milkweed) ☼☺βχ *may be late & not for sale yet

COLOR: Deep pink HEIGHT: 2-5'
BLOOM: June - July SOIL: Well-drained
COMMENTS: Best known as food for monarch caterpillars. Robust and fragrant.

Asclepias tuberosa (Butterfly Weed) ☼☺βχ

COLOR: Bright orange HEIGHT: 24"
BLOOM: July – August SOIL: Well-drained sandy or gravelly soil
COMMENTS: Blooms followed in autumn by canoe-shaped seed pods that send forth silky seeds; good for cut flower; pods good for arrangements.

Aster cordifolius (Blue Wood Aster) ☼○⌘☺βχ

COLOR: Blue HEIGHT: 2-3'
BLOOM: Late Summer SOIL: average to dry
COMMENTS: Clouds of blue flowers in early fall in shade! A great naturalizer under trees, at the edge of woods, or as a filler .

Aster divaricatus (Wite Wood Aster) ☼○⌘☺βχρ

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 2-3'
BLOOM: Late summer, fall SOIL: Dry, average
COMMENTS: Produces a fairyland of glistening small white daisies in September and October. Lovely when naturalized in shade and average to dry soil. Found in deciduous woods and along roadsides of the Eastern US.

Aster novae-angliae—“Purple Dome” (New England Aster) ☼○☺βχ

COLOR: Deep purple HEIGHT: 18"
BLOOM: August—September SOIL: Moist to average
COMMENTS: Compact variety that provides a burst of vivid deep purple color

***Bochmeria cylindrica (False Nettle)** ☼○☼β☺⌘

COLOR: Yellow green HEIGHT: 3'
BLOOM: June-August SOIL: Medium-wet
COMMENTS: Tiny greenish flowers are in small, head-like clusters, arranged in continuous or interrupted spikes. Plant lacks stinging hairs.

***Boltonia asteroides (False Aster)** ☼β☺⌘

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 5-6'
BLOOM: Late Summer, Early Fall SOIL: Average, medium
COMMENTS: Tiny, daisy-like flowers cover this aster-like plant with a profuse bloom from late summer to early fall. Flowers typically have white rays with yellow center disks, but sometimes the rays are pink-tinged, violet or purple.

Callirhoe involucrata (Wine Cups/Purple Poppymallow) ☼☺χ

COLOR: Pink HEIGHT: 6-8"
BLOOM: Summer SOIL: Dry to moist, well-drained soil
COMMENTS: Attractive plant with low growing, dark green foliage with an explosion of electric purple, single flowers. This plant behaves like an ivy. Let it drape over stone walls or creep between stones.

Caltha palustris (Marsh Marigold) ☼○☺χ

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 8-12"
BLOOM: Early SOIL: Moist to wet
COMMENTS: Shiny green, round foliage, one of the first wildflowers to bloom in early spring.

***Carex plantaginea (Plantain Lea Sedge/Seersucker Sedge)** ☼☼○χ⌘☺

COLOR: Green HEIGHT: 8-10"
BLOOM: Early Spring/Semi Evergreen SOIL: Moist, average
COMMENTS: Bold textural contrast with broad shiny deep green leaves that are puckered like holiday ribbon. Should be cut back in late winter to maintain its bright appearance.

Chelone glabra (Turtlehead) ☼○☺χ

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 2-4'
BLOOM: August – September SOIL: Slightly acid moist soil
COMMENTS: Native; lustrous, deep green foliage; upright perennial; flowers in small clusters on stems; pinch shoot tips in Spring for bushier growth.

Chelone obliqua ‘Tiny Tortuga’ (Turtlehead) ☼○⌘χρ

COLOR: Pink HEIGHT: 18-24"
BLOOM: Summer SOIL: average to moist
COMMENTS: A tiny turtlehead with all the flower power of its taller brothers, this native cultivar features uniquely shaped, hot pink blooms atop lustrous dark green leaves with a bronzy sheen. Flowers reminiscent of turtles' mouths persist from mid-summer into fall,

Clematis virginiana (Old Man’s Beard or Virgin’s Bower) ☼☼○⌘☺χρ

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 12-20'
BLOOM: Late summer, fall SOIL: Average, moist
COMMENTS: This vigorous native *Clematis virginiana* is covered in showy, sweetly-scented white flowers. Hummingbirds and bees enjoy the nectar while songbirds roost in the foliage

Coreopsis lanceolata (Lanceleaf Coreopsis) ☼☼☼ϱ

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 2'
BLOOM: Summer SOIL: Dry, average

COMMENTS: This vibrant native wildflower is a standout in any sunny garden, known for its large, daisy-like golden-yellow blooms that appear singly atop slender, upright stems. With an impressively long blooming season, it brings months of cheerful color to the landscape.

Coreopsis tripteris 'Gold Standard' (Tall Tickseed) ☼☼☼ϱ

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 5-6'
BLOOM: Summer SOIL: average

COMMENTS: A tall-growing, long-blooming perennial, that is very cold hardy and easy-to-grow. Its numerous, large, bright-yellow flowers appear in late summer and attract lots of butterflies.

Echinacea - 'Cheyenne Spirit' (Coneflower) ☼○β⋈χϱ

COLOR: Mixed colors (see comments) HEIGHT: 24-30"
BLOOM: July - August SOIL: Average to dry soil

COMMENTS: This plant flowers in a variety of colors from purple, pink, red and orange tones to lighter yellows, creams and whites.

Echinacea purpurea "Ruby Star"- (Purple coneflower) ☼○☼βχ

COLOR: Violet HEIGHT: 2-3'
BLOOM: Summer SOIL: average to dry, well-drained soil

COMMENTS: Large flat topped flowers that are a deeper purple pink, almost ruby red, than most others. Easy to grow, tough, and heat and drought tolerant once established.

***Eragrostis spectabilis (Purple Lovegrass)**☼χ☺☼

COLOR: Soft redish purple HEIGHT: 1-2'
BLOOM: July, August SOIL: Dry, Average

COMMENTS: Warm season bunchgrass that is native to sandy soils. Flat, coarse, mostly basal, green leaves form a somewhat disorganized clump of foliage that typically rises to 10" tall.

***Fragaria virginiana (Virginia Strawberry)**☼○ϱ☺☼

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 3-9"
BLOOM: April, May SOIL: Moist, well-drained

COMMENTS: Ground-hugging herbaceous perennial that spreads indefinitely by runners which root to form new plants as they sprawl along the ground, often forming large colonies over time.

Helianthus salicifolius 'First Light' (Willow-Leaved Sunflower)☼ρχ

COLOR: PYellow HEIGHT: 3-4'
BLOOM: September-October SOIL: Well Drained, Average

COMMENTS: First Light is extremely floriferous, producing hundreds of golden yellow flowers in late summer. Thanks to its native roots, this sun-seeking plant is highly drought-tolerant once established

Heliopsis helianthoides (False Sunflower) ☼○βϱ

COLOR: Red, yellow HEIGHT: 3 - 4'
BLOOM: Late summer SOIL: Moist or dry

COMMENTS: "Burning Hearts" is a show-stopping color that is also attractive to bees and butterflies.

***Hibiscus moscheutos (Swamp Rosemallow)** ☼○β

COLOR: Pink to white HEIGHT: 3 - 7'
BLOOM: Late summer SOIL: Wet

COMMENTS: Shrublike herbaceous perennial with large, glabrous leaves and 4-5" wide flowers that last only for one day, but appear consistently until the end of the season.

Iris versicolor (Blue Flag) ☼○☺

COLOR: Blue HEIGHT: 3'
BLOOM: May & June SOIL: Moist.

COMMENTS: This is a clump-forming iris that is native to marshes, swamps, wet meadows, ditches and shorelines. Moist location essential. The sword shaped blue-green clumping leaves are topped with a mass of blue lavender to white blooms.

Lobelia cardinalis (Cardinal Flower) ☼○☺⋈

COLOR: Scarlet red HEIGHT: 2-4'
BLOOM: July - September SOIL: Very moist

COMMENTS: A spike of flowers. Will self-seed. This plant is pollinated exclusively by hummingbirds.

Lobelia siphilitica (Great Blue Lobelia) ☼○☺β⋈

COLOR: Blue HEIGHT: 30"
BLOOM: July - September SOIL: Moist

COMMENTS: Vigorous; will self-seed.

Lonicera sempervirens (Trumpet Honeysuckle Vine) ☼○☺⋈ρ☼ϱ

COLOR: Red HEIGHT: 3-6'
BLOOM: May - frost SOIL: Average

COMMENTS: A vine that is perfect for arbors and trellises. Hummingbird magnet.

Lonicera sempervirens "Magnifica" (Trumpet Honeysuckle Vine) ☼○☺⋈ρ☼ϱ

COLOR: Orange, Red HEIGHT: 4-7'
BLOOM: May - frost SOIL: Moist, well-drained

COMMENTS: A vine that is perfect for arbors and trellises. Hummingbird magnet.

***Ludwigia palustris (Marsh Seedbox)** ☀️🌑☺️⌘

COLOR: white (basal/inconspicuous) HEIGHT: 3-12"
BLOOD: June-August SOIL: Wet, muddy or shallow water
COMMENTS: Its stems are semi-succulent, light green to dark reddish in color, and smooth or slightly hairy. Foliage is rounded, shiny medium green to dark reddish green in color. Becomes redder when exposed to bright sunlight.

Meehania cordata (Meehan's Mint, or Creeping Mint) 🌑🌑⌘⌘☺️

COLOR: Blue Violet HEIGHT: 12"
BLOOD: Late Spring-Early Summer SOIL: Moist to average
COMMENTS: Long, trailing stems run across the ground and root along the way. In late spring the green carpet gives way to hundreds of blue flowers opening to reveal spotted throats.

Monarda 'Petite Delight' (Bee Balm) ☀️🌑⌘⌘⌘

COLOR: Pink HEIGHT: 12-15"
BLOOD: July & August SOIL: Average, well-drained
COMMENTS: More compact than others in the species. Very low maintenance. Cherished by butterflies and hummingbirds, but loathed by deer. Also makes an excellent cut flower!

Monarda didyma - 'Jacob Cline' (Bee Balm) ☀️☺️⌘⌘⌘

COLOR: Rich red HEIGHT: 30"
BLOOD: June - July SOIL: Moist, rich soil
COMMENTS: Fragrant aromatic foliage; numerous tubular flowers extend out of a ball-shaped whorl; vigorous growth habits; much more mildew resistant and larger flowered; good cut flower.

Monarda fistulosa 'Clair Grace' (Wild Bergamont) ☀️☺️⌘⌘⌘

COLOR: Pale lavender HEIGHT: 2-4'
BLOOD: June - July SOIL: average
COMMENTS: Aromatic leaves are used in Earl Grey tea.

***Pachysandra procubens (Allegheny Spurge)** 🌑🌑☺️⌘

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 6-10"
BLOOD: Late spring, early summer SOIL: Dry, Average
COMMENTS: Native evergreen gem. Fragrant, white flower spikes appear in spring, later becoming camouflaged by a new flush of gorgeous, crisp green foliage..

Packera aurea, formerly Senecio aureus (Golden Ragwort) ☀️🌑🌑☺️⌘

COLOR: Bright golden HEIGHT: 12"
BLOOD: May SOIL: Average to moist
COMMENTS: Prefers partial shade. A strong ground cover where happy.

***Panicum virgatum (Switchgrass)** ☀️🌑⌘⌘⌘

COLOR: Red HEIGHT: 3-5'
BLOOD: Summer SOIL: Average to dry
COMMENTS: An upright landscape grass with lovely blue green foliage that turns yellow in fall. In late summer airy wheat-colored flowers appear and remain attractive well into fall. Easy to Grow.

Phlox divaricata - 'May Breeze' (Woodland Phlox) 🌑🌑⌘⌘⌘

COLOR: White, pale blue HEIGHT: 12-15"
BLOOD: Late Spring - Early Summer SOIL: Average to moist
COMMENTS: A small-statured wild sweet william with loose clusters of fragrant, pale blue, almost white flowers that drive the butterflies wild!.

Phlox paniculata - 'Jeana' (Garden Phlox) ☀️🌑⌘⌘⌘

COLOR: Pink HEIGHT: 4-5'
BLOOD: Late Summer to Fall SOIL: Average, well-drained
COMMENTS: Varying shades of sweetly scented, lavender-pink flowers, vibrant midsummer through early autumn. Expect butterflies and other pollinators.

***Phlox stolonifera - "Sherwood Purple" (Creeping Phlox)** ☀️🌑⌘⌘⌘

COLOR: pale blue HEIGHT: 6-10"
BLOOD: April-May SOIL: Rich
COMMENTS: Masses of star-like, clear purple flowers with deep green foliage. A beautifully vibrant groundcover that will bring excitement to the shade or woodland garden .

Physostegia virginiana 'Miss Manners' (Obedience Plant) ☀️☺️⌘

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 18-24"
BLOOD: June to October SOIL: Average
COMMENTS: Pure white snapdragon-like flowers from June to September over deep green, glossy foliage. A nice late season addition to the garden for bees and hummingbirds.

***Physostegia virginiana 'Pink Manners' (Obedience Plant)** ☀️☺️⌘

COLOR: Orchid pink or white HEIGHT: 36"
BLOOD: June to October SOIL: Average
COMMENTS: Tubular flowers in shades of lavender-pink adorn this taller version of 'Miss Manners' with attractive medium green foliage

***Podophyllum peltatum (May Apple) *** ☉ ☺

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 12-18"
BLOOM: March-May SOIL: Moist, well-drained
COMMENTS: Nice addition to a shade or woodland garden.

Polemonium reptans (Spreading Jacobs Ladder) * ☉ ☺

COLOR: light blue HEIGHT: 10-12"
BLOOM: Late Spring SOIL: Average to moist
COMMENTS: A free-flowering woodland native with delicate light blue flowers topping ladder-like foliage in late spring. A good light-textured groundcover in areas with average to moist soils.

***Polygonatum biflorum (Great Solomon's Seal) *** ☉ ☺ ☞

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 1-3'
BLOOM: April, May SOIL: Moist, well-drained
COMMENTS: This plant has long, arching stems that dangle cream-colored, bell-shaped flowers in early spring. Large purple seeds and golden leaves add interest in fall.

Pycnanthemum flexuosum (Appalachian Mountain Mint) * ☉ ☽ β χ

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 20-30"
BLOOM: Late Summer SOIL: Well-drained
COMMENTS: An aromatic, blooming over a long period. A good soil stabilizer. Foliage develops an attractive red tinge in autumn. Incorporate along the perennial border, rain garden, or near the vegetable garden to entice pollinators.

Rudbeckia fulgida 'Goldstrum' (Black-eyed Susan 'Goldstrum') * ☉ ☺ β χ

COLOR: Bright gold HEIGHT: 24-30"
BLOOM: July-Oct. SOIL: Average to dry
COMMENTS: Bright gold petals with a deep brown cone highlight the garden in late summer .

Rudbeckia triloba (Brown-eyed Susan) * ☉ ☺ β χ

COLOR: bright gold HEIGHT: 2-3'
BLOOM: July-Oct. SOIL: Average to dry
COMMENTS: Hundreds of small, deep gold flowers bloom July through October! A naturalizing self seeder. Biennial or short-lived perennial. Very drought, heat and pest tolerant.

Ruellia humilis (Fringed-leaf Petunia) * ☉ ❖ ☽ χ

COLOR: Pink to purple HEIGHT: 2-3'
BLOOM: All summer SOIL: Dry, basic.
COMMENTS: Long flowering period. Drought tolerant.

Rudbeckia subtomentosa 'Henry Eilers' (Sweet Black-eyed Susan) * ☉ ☽ β χ

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 4-5'
BLOOM: Late Summer SOIL: Average , moist
COMMENTS: 'Henry Eilers' has finely quilled flowers of true yellow, not gold, and is stunning in a mass planting..

***Sanguinaria canadensis (Bloodroot) *** ☉ ☺

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 6-10"
BLOOM: March-April S SOIL: Moist, well drained.
COMMENTS: Each flower stalk has one solitary flower. The sap of the plant is red, thus the name.

Silene caroliniana 'Short & Sweet' (Wild Pink) * ☉ ☽ * β ☺

COLOR: Deep Pink HEIGHT: 6-8"
BLOOM: Late spring /early summer SOIL: Average to rich, moist to dry
COMMENTS: Compact and easy to grow, it is an excellent choice for bright shade or full sun. Covered in deep pink flowers

Sisyrinchium angustifolium 'Lucern' (Blue-eyed Grass) * ☉ ☽ χ

COLOR: Purple HEIGHT: 10-12"
BLOOM: Late spring-early summer SOIL: Moist, well drained
COMMENTS: Great little plant for borders, pathways, rock gardens and woodlands edge with a thin, grassy-looking foliage.

Solidago Little Lemon 'Dansolitem' (Goldenrod) * ☽ β χ ρ

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 12-18"
BLOOM: Late Summer, Fall SOIL: Average, moist
COMMENTS: This diminutive beauty is exceptionally compact with bright, light yellow flowers beginning in late summer and lasting well into fall.

Solidago sphacelate 'Golden Fleece' (Goldenrod, or Autumn Goldenrod) * ☉ β χ ☽

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 18-24"
BLOOM: Late summer SOIL: Average, Dry
COMMENTS: Stunning show of sprays of golden yellow flowers. Semievergreen heart-shaped leaves. Truly an excellent groundcover and bee and butterfly charmer! .

***Tiarella cordifolia (Foamflower)** *○☺

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 5" (Spring stalks 8-12")
 BLOOM: Early Spring SOIL: Moist, rich soil.
 COMMENTS: Excellent ground cover or shady edge. Spreads quickly.

Thermopsis villosa (Carolina Lupine) ☼χ

COLOR: Yellow HEIGHT: 3-4'
 BLOOM: Summer SOIL: Average
 COMMENTS: Clump-forming perennial with dense spikes of sulphur yellow. Compound foliage is attractive late into the season. Very durable and long lived once established. Beautiful cut flower.

Tradescantia ohiensis (Spiderwort) ☼○☺

COLOR: lavender HEIGHT: 2-3'
 BLOOM: June - September SOIL: moist to dry
 COMMENTS: This Pennsylvania Native is a great landscape plant for hot sunny locations, unlike others in the genus. Attractive bluish-grey foliage with flowers in blue, pink or purple from early June to September.

***Uniola paniculata (Sea Oats)** ☼χ

COLOR: White HEIGHT: 4-6'
 BLOOM: Summer SOIL: Well drained, sandy
 COMMENTS: Slow growing, warm season grass. Tall growing plant with long thin leaves. Large seed heads that turn golden brown in late summer give the plant its common name.

Veronicastrum virginicum (Lavender Towers) ☼○βχ⌘

COLOR: Violet HEIGHT: 4-5'
 BLOOM: Late summer Soil: Well-drained
 COMMENTS: Attractive to pollinators. Drought tolerant, good for meadows or backdrop of naturalized gardens.

***Matteuccia struthiopteris (Ostrich Fern)** *○☺⌘⌘

HEIGHT: 3-5' SOIL: Well-drained, moist- neutral to acid
 COMMENTS: Tolerates some sunshine. Large, plume-like, medium green fern. Grows in graceful vase-like clumps from a stout rootstock.. Very hardy. Spreads Quickly.

***Onoclea sensibilis (Sensitive Fern)** ☼○☺⌘⌘

Height: 3-4' Soil: Medium to wet
 COMMENTS: Tolerates full sun. Excellent ground cover.

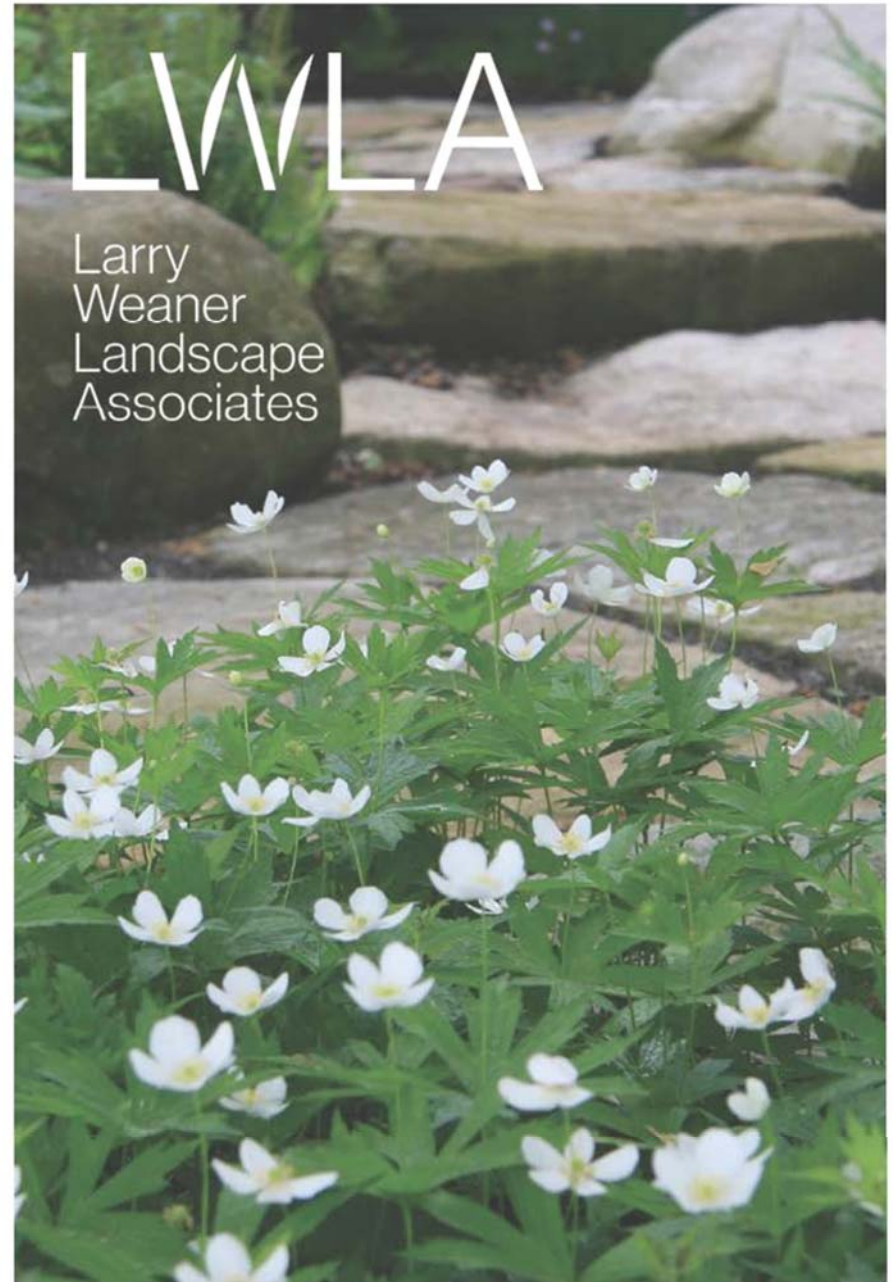
